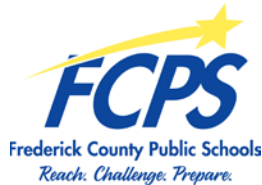

Youth Apprentice Program Student Application Instructions



Students interested in participating in the Youth Apprentice Program should complete an application packet and email it to their schools Work Based Learning Coordinator.

A complete application packet must include the following:

1. A completed Youth Apprentice Program Student Application Form

2. A cover letter, which should address the following:

- Identify the position for which you are applying
- Why you want to be a youth apprentice
- How your career interests relate to the apprentice program for which you are applying
- Description of how you think any related high school courses you are currently taking or have taken in the past (Career and Technology Education (CTE) courses, mathematics, English, etc.) will help you succeed in your apprenticeship
- Why we should consider you to be a participant in the Youth Apprentice Program

3. A resume which includes:

- Career Objective
- Education (including any courses or training you have completed that support your qualifications and interest in the Youth Apprentice Program)
- Personal Strengths (encouraging others; working as part of a team; being accurate or precise; visualizing colors, shapes, and concepts; fixing, repairing, building and using tools; keeping deadlines, etc.)
- High School Awards and Honors
- Volunteer and Community Service
- Extra-curricular activities
- Employment information (including unpaid internships)
- Additional Skills, Hobbies

4. A completed Teacher Evaluation Form

- Email form to a teacher who knows you well. They will complete it and send it to your schools' Work Based Learning Coordinator.
